4. Contact Breeze from sbsh.net
5. iLauncher from sbsh.net
6. Audible Player from audible.com for audio books
7. AvantGo from avantgo.com for reading news and RSS
8. BugMe from electricpocket.com for scribbling notes
9. Sprite Backup from spritesoftware.com for backups
10. Resco Explorer from resco.net for exploring my files
11. WM5Storage, found at modoco.com. This turns my PDA into a USB storage device
12. WisBar Lite from lakeridgesoftware.com, for my cascading menu and task manager

13. eMoze from emoze.com. This allows me to sync up with my corporate desktop over the air

There are other apps, but these are the crucial ones I use every day.
